Wonder if Bob and Liz jumped as high in the air as the Little Rockers when they learned what they had done?

I also wanted to give a special shout-out to Brent Barton, who along with a couple of his firefighter buddies and some of you, managed to organize and run a sold-out Firefighter's Bonspiel just before Christmas. Over \$6,000 was raised for Camp Bucko, a charity group that runs a summer camp for child burn victims. And it probably comes as no surprise that we had a lot of volunteer interest in this one, albeit heavily weighted to the female membership. Ultimately we had to replace the pump, which was installed the week of the 8th. As circumstances would have it, we quickly discovered that the new pump was incompatible with some of our older, existing systems, tripping a breaker and causing us to lose a day of curling. On behalf of management and all of us on the Board our apologies to the leagues affected.

I mention this incident to reinforce two things. First and foremost, we have excellent staff working for us here at the Club. Thanks to their skills and dedication, including identifying some creative temporary measures and working through the wee hours of the morning on the ice itself, we are able to enjoy our curling with only minimal disruption. Second to reiterate a theme that I raised in my last article, we cannot ignore the fact that we have an older facility with a lot of older equipment. It is instances like this that continue to reinforce the need for us to be diligent in the management of our facility and to be prepared for the future. That is something that we must continue to focus on going forward, and remains a priority of the Board.

But as I said last time, that's an ongoing topic of discussion. For now, enjoy the rest of the season and "good curling"!

Bonspiels

A New Year means Bonspiel Time at the Whitby Curling Club

A *Bonspiel* is the term used to describe a curling tournament. Bon has been known to mean "good" as in *bon* for French or a shortened *bonnie* in Scottish. Spiel being the German/Dutch word for "play". It is traditionally known to mean good play or a good time. What it means to a WCC member is a GOOD TIME HAD BY ALL!!

Saturday January 26th will see the renewal of **The Robbie Burns spiel**. This year we are having a "Battle of the Clans". Curlers will sign up to represent one of the 3 fine Scottish clans and will do battle on the ice in a variety of curling formats for the yearlong bragging rights that will come with victory. What better way to celebrate your on ice battles then with fun behind the glass including men in kilts, an official Scotch Nosing followed by a traditional Burn's supper. I can hear the pipes now and taste the whisky and the Haggis.....yeah, yeah, if you've eaten a hot dog you've already eaten everything that goes into Haggis. The Burns Spiel is one of my favorite events of the winter and definitely a bucket-list item for those that have not tried this terrific event.

For our more "experienced" curlers we have a great event in **The Gus Brown Senior Men's Bonspiel** on February 1st. Being south of 50 years old I cannot tell you personally what are the goings on here but suffice to say that it is a very popular event. For roughly 30 years this event has been a pinnacle of senior men's

curling at the WCC. With 96 curlers forming 24 teams, competitors gather from all over eastern Ontario representing towns from Brighton through to Peterborough, and Scarborough through to our very own Whitby. So c'mon lads sign up and defend the honor of the WCC against curlers from all over eastern Ontario.

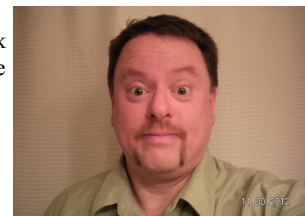

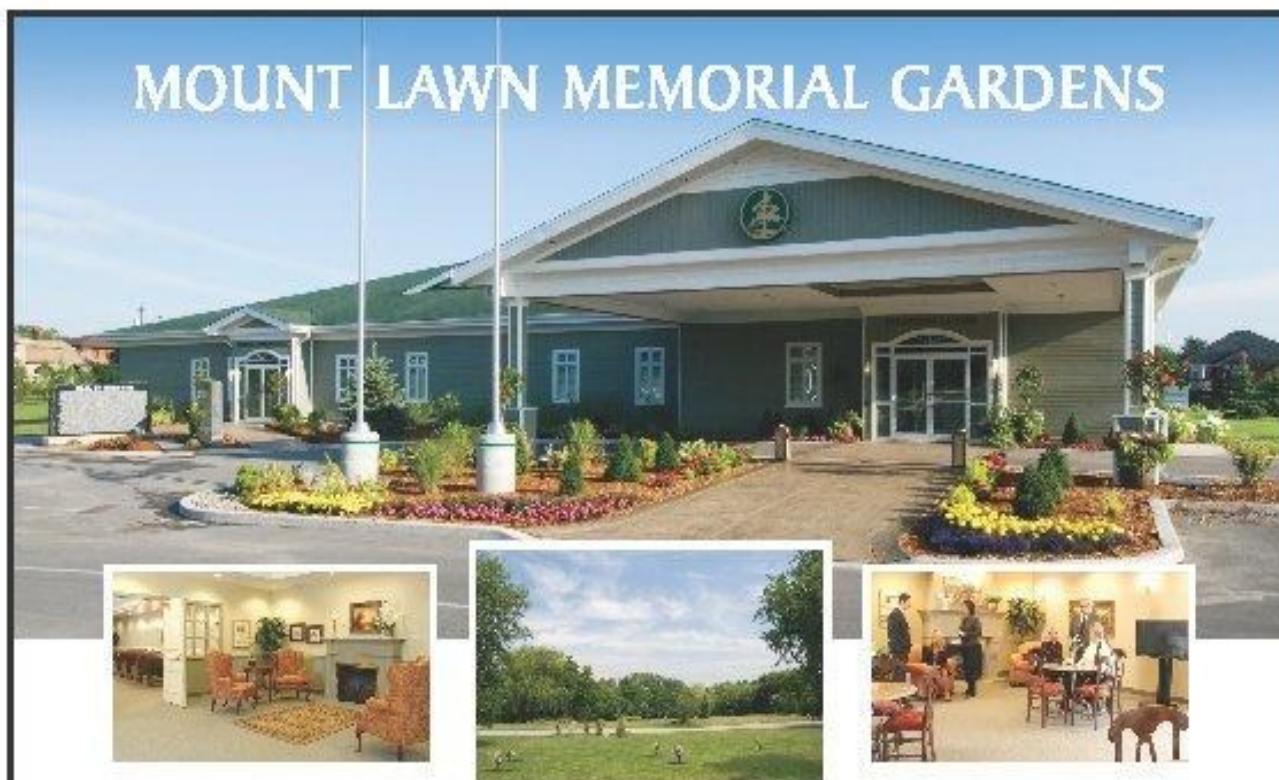
50-50+ Winners

Strathcona Cup 2013



We are happy to announce that we will be hosting a group of curlers all the way from Scotland. They arrived in Canada on Jan 10 to start their tour. The last time they were here was in January 2003 and we were a part of the host clubs at that time as well. Apparently they are talking tough and are ready to win back the trophy that was won by Canada on the last tour. It's a tradition that started in 1902, when a resolution passed at the Annual General Meeting of the Royal Caledonia Curling Club supported sending 25 Scottish curlers to Canada for a friendly competition. The tour was

such a success that the Canadians made a return visit in 1909, and the ongoing battle for the Strathcona Cup began. The Scots will be playing at 21 host clubs in the Central and South Western Ontario part of the Tour. They will be at Whitby on Sunday January 20 to play against 4 teams that we have put together to do our part to try and keep the trophy in Canada. It promises to be a fun afternoon. There will be 5 teams, one will sit out and be hosted by a group of volunteers while the other 4 teams are on the ice. After the games we will be hosting our guests to a dinner before we wish them well and send them off to their hotel for the evening. 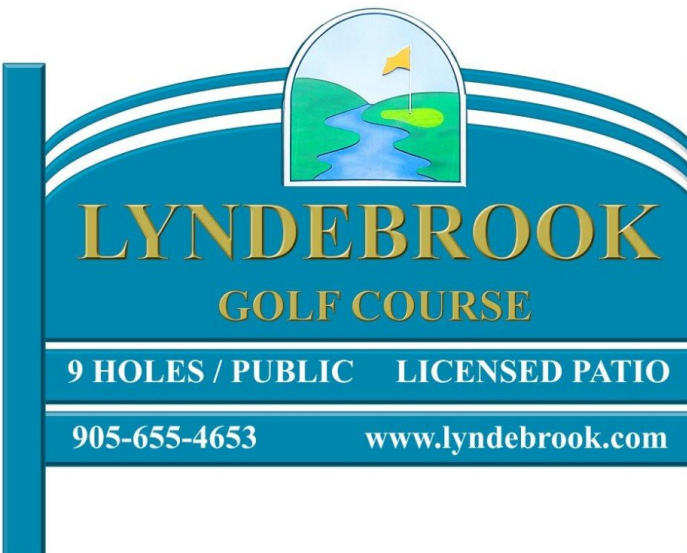
The competition level was very high as a number of teams saw this as an opportunity to get some playing time in advance of zone and regional play downs in January.

Speeding Up Play

You are down by 6, and in the 5th end you get your 2 and feel the tide turning. Suddenly your opposition's skip has lost their draw weight and one of their players can no longer hit the broom if their life depended on it and you feel it, that wonderful hope and then BUZZZZZZ the buzzer sounds!! Oh no, how can the team possibly come back when the opposition has hammer this end and it looks like there is a good chance that they will get at least 1 more and there is only one more end to play. Then you start to think... why didn't we start on time? Why is it taking so long to get the end started? Why? Why? Why?... You feel there should be an asterisk next to your score that says: we were getting hot but ran out of time and didn't get to finish the game.

You have the late game, and it is in the middle of the week. Bad luck with the scheduling but everyone has their turn with this. The game is scheduled to start at 9 pm so you should be done by 11pm. You get to the club ready to go but something has happened. The sheet you are scheduled to play on has not finished their game, it is a close game, and ends up being delayed by 30 minutes, so much for getting to sleep before midnight. Frustrating isn't it?

Did you know that in an 8 end game, if there is a 30 second delay on every shot it will create a delay of one hour?

Luckily there is a lot that everyone on the team can do to avoid this. These tips are not just for new curlers, they are for everyone. Sometimes we develop habits that we don't realize are affecting the pace of play and don't always realize the cumulative effect these can have. Let's take a look and try out some of these tips so we can enjoy a full 8 ends of play within the allotted 2 hours. Perhaps we could make this a club-wide New Year resolution to do all we can to speed up play while still enjoying our time on the ice!

FOR EVERYONE

- Be at the club ready to play at least 15 minutes before game time in order to stretch
- Go to your sheet 5 minutes prior to the start time in order to shake hands with the other team, do the coin toss and have your practice slides. If you are waiting for another game to finish on your sheet consider doing the handshakes and coin toss before you go out to the sheet so that you are not delayed further
- Do not set up the rocks for the opponents. If they are not throwing their rocks sequentially, they will just have to change them out which will delay the game. It can also be a tripping hazard and will take time for the other person to move that rock out of the way.
- As soon as the opposition has delivered their stone, the next thrower should immediately prepare their rock and be ready to shoot

SWEEPERS

- When you have finished sweeping your rock, please head immediately for the side of the sheet and walk down so that there is a clear line of site for the opposing skip to show their next thrower their call



SKIPS

- Please be ready to start the end right away. If your lead has prepared themselves in the hack be ready to show them the call
- If your opposition is taking some time to decide on a call, this is a great time to sort any of your stones that are no longer in play so that your players do not have to do this at the start of the next end
- Skips can do their part to keep the game moving by minimizing the delay while deciding upon a shot. Certainly take the time you need, but lengthy conferences should be avoided.

THIRDS

- Pick an appropriate time to put up the score that will not delay you returning to sweep one of your rocks or for you to throw.
- Be ready at the other end of the ice to hold the broom for your skip when it is your skip's turn to throw

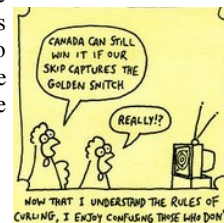
FRONT END

- Please set up the skips stone in front of the hack while they are making the call with the third.

LEADS

- You know you are the most important member of the team so it only stands that you can have a real impact on the speed of play.
- Let the seconds and thirds on your team put the rocks away at the end of an end. You can use this time to prepare yourself in the hack and be ready to start the next end immediately.

Hopefully if we all follow these tips we can get our full 8 ends in every game. This is another way that curling and golf are so similar. Think of the buzzer as the course marshal who keeps things running on time for the enjoyment of everyone playing!

League and Bonsel Sponsorships – These sponsorships are handled directly through the leagues and bonsel organizing committees. All funds from these sponsorships go directly to the league or bonsel to support prizes, trophies and anything else required to run them. Each league or bonsel manages their own sponsorships as long as they comply with the clubs sponsorship requirements overall.

On-Ice Camera Program – This is a new opportunity for individuals or businesses to support improving the viewing of games. You may have noticed that we now have cameras and lounge monitors on sheets 3 and 4. The cameras are placed over the house at each end of the rink, the monitors can toggle between ends using the remote controls found by each monitor. We have a need to purchase and install 4 more monitors and 8 more on-ice cameras. Anyone can sponsor a monitor and 2 cameras, or you can choose to sponsor half a sheet. The costs are for the equipment only and no funds are retained by the club. The costs are as follows:

- Onetime fee for 2 cameras and one monitor is \$1375 plus HST
- Onetime fee for 1 camera and one monitor is \$915 plus HST
- If a sheet is split between 2 sponsors there would be a onetime fee of \$687.50 plus HST each

Sponsors will be recognized by their name/logo being placed on the button of the end(s) having the cameras as well as a name plate on the lounge monitor. (The cost of the artwork on the button is at the sponsor's expense). Sponsors names will remain for 5 years or for the life of the camera/monitors, whichever is less.
